






Is your business premises in one of the hotspots?

Bushfire hotspots are relevant year-round, not just during the fire season. Factors that come into play include vegetative growth, humidity, wind, rainfall, lighting and temperature inversions.

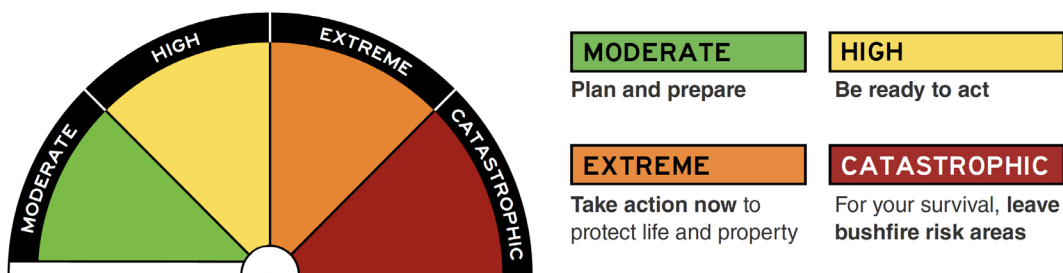
According to the Bureau of Meteorology (BoM), Australia has five fire danger seasons:

-  Winter and spring
-  Spring
-  Spring and summer
-  Summer
-  Summer and autumn.
