Hepatitis B Refresher

Hepatitis C Refresher

Viral hepatitis care for people with renal impairment

People living with viral hepatitis and renal impairment have different care needs. In this session, A/Prof Jacinta Holmes will walk us through these differences and how to optimise care for these clients. A/Prof Jacinta Holmes is a full-time senior staff specialist in the Gastroenterology Department at St Vincent's Hospital, Melbourne and Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Melbourne.

Week 4: Tuesday 24th February: 12:30 - 13:15
Alcohol related liver disease

In this session Dr Tim Phan, Addiction Medicine Registrar & Gastroenterology fellow at St Vincents Hospital Melbourne, will explore the prevalence of alcohol related liver disease, how alcohol affects the liver, and current approaches to assessment and management.

WEEK 5: Tuesday 3rd March: 12:30pm - 1:15pm
Hepatitis C - point of care testing in practice

Hepatitis C point of care testing (POCT) is crucial to support hepatitis C elimination efforts. In this session, Chloe Layton, Hepatology Clinical Nurse Consultant for the Statewide Prison Hepatitis Assessment and Treatment Program will discuss how POCT improves hepatitis C diagnosis & linkage to care and will also look at the practical considerations for implementing POCT in different settings.

WEEK 6: Tuesday 10th March: 12:30pm - 1:15pm
When do I refer my patient to a Liver Specialist?

Primary care serves an important role in managing viral hepatitis and other liver disease in the community. But when or how do community care providers know when to refer to a liver specialist? In this session, Phoebe Van Lambaart - Hepatology Nurse Practitioner for Latrobe regional Health - will cover common clinical scenarios, red flags for advanced liver disease, interpretation of common assessment tools or tests, and how timely referral can improve patient outcomes.

WEEK 7: Tuesday 17th March: 12:30pm - 1:15pm
Viral Hepatitis in immunocompromised people

In this session, Dr David Iser - Hepatologist and Gastroenterologist at St Vincents Hospital Melbourne - will explore how hepatitis B and C behave in the context of immunosuppression, key risks such as reactivation, and practical considerations for clinical management

Hepatitis C testing in mental health settings
