Gippsland PHN seeking clinical and community voices to shape local health system

Gippsland PHN is inviting expressions of interest from community members and health professionals to join two key advisory groups that help shape the future of primary health care in the region.

The Community Advisory Committee and Clinical Council play a vital role in guiding the Gippsland PHN Board and have paid three-year terms available, commencing 1 July 2026.

Community members and carers who can share insights into local health system experiences are encouraged to apply for the Community Advisory Committee, which provides advice on improving and integrating health care services and planning, and advocates for initiatives that strengthen the primary health care system.

Expressions of Interest are also open for the Clinical Council, which represents a range of clinical and health sector perspectives and focuses on regional clinical issues, population health priorities, innovative service opportunities and the design of locally relevant clinical pathways.

Amanda Proposch, Chief Executive Officer of Gippsland PHN, said these groups deliver timely and valuable perspectives, lived experience and industry knowledge that is an integral part of the organisation's decision-making.

"These advisory groups bring together a range of perspectives, ensuring community voices and clinical expertise guides our work. It helps us identify local needs, strengthen services and support improved health outcomes across the region.

"We're encouraging people with diverse backgrounds and experiences, who are passionate about improving primary health care in Gippsland, to apply," Ms Proposch said.
